

# Postgraduate Certificate in Healthcare Practice

- 60 credit modules, at Level 7
- Portfolio option; London SPIN-New to Practice Fellowship Programme

A limited number of places are on offer on a Postgraduate Certificate in Healthcare Practice, to GP fellows as part of our London SPIN-New to Practice Fellowship Scheme. The PG Cert comprises three 20 credit modules, with sessions delivered on the same day each week over 12 months during the Academic Year 2023-24. It is aimed for face-to-face teaching sessions to be delivered in a London venue.

## Overview

The course helps develop systems leadership and workforce transformation skills through delivery of academically underpinned quality improvement projects, with a 'subject specific' module based on a GP fellows' clinical area of interest with an academic assignment.

### Module 1: Healthcare Practice (20 credit modules)

- Introduction/ Examine current and future healthcare challenges
- Explore the role of service –users for healthcare provision

### Module 2: Leadership: (20 credit modules)

- Knowledge of leadership within and across organisations
- The concepts of leadership; individuals vs organisations
- Exploring fellows current/ developing leadership.

### Module 3: Negotiated learning (20 credit modules)

- Exploring/ expanding Fellows personal and professional development as negotiated, in relation to their professional setting.

## Funding and spaces available

- Places are funded by the scheme and include a bursary of £18,964 per GP fellow, accessible via your local Training Hub. (As the bursary payment contributes towards 2 clinical sessions, fellows are expected to keep Tuesday's free for taught and masterclass sessions, and allot for study).
- 7 places are on offer within each of the five London ICS footprints.
