Resource	Summary
<u>PAMVR Leaflet</u>	The PA managed voluntary register (PAMVR) is a register of qualified PAs who have been declared fit to practice in the UK and is held by the FPA. This leaflet provides an overview of the aims of the PAMVR and how to check whether a PA is on the register.
<u>FPA Code of Conduct</u>	In conjunction with the requirements of the PAMVR, this document aims to set out the guiding ethical and moral principles and values that physician associates are expected to apply in their daily practice, until statutory regulation is achieved. The FPA code of conduct has been written in collaboration with the GMC and is based upon the principles of GMC Good Medical Practice .
<u>PA And AA Generic and Shared Learning Outcomes</u>	This document describes the generic and shared professional capabilities and outcomes that newly qualified PAs and AAs must meet to be registered by the GMC.
<u>Good Medical Practice: Interim Standards for PAs and AAs</u>	This guidance is based on Good medical practice principles for doctors and has been tailored for PA and AAs. Full guidance will come into effect at the start of regulation and comprises of four sections related to professional values and behaviours: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • knowledge, skills and performance • safety and quality • communication, partnership and teamwork • maintaining trust
<u>Achieving Good Medical Practice: Interim Guidance for PA and AA Students</u>	This guidance demonstrates how the principles and values of Good Medical Practice applies to PA students and outlines the standards expected both inside and outside of courses and placements.
<u>Physician Associate Curriculum</u>	This curriculum has been created by the FPA and aligned to the GMCs generic and shared learning outcomes for PAs and AAs to help support HEIs in the creation of PA programmes to ensure that future graduates are prepared to meet the GMC expected outcomes.
<u>Physician Associate Registration Assessment (PARA) Content Map</u>	PAs currently take the PA National examination (PANE) on completion of a HEI course – this consists of a written assessment and objective structured clinical examination (OSCE). From Summer 2025 onwards this will change to the PA registration assessment (PARA) in line with GMC regulation. This document outlines the knowledge and skills required for this assessment and will replace the previous matrix specification of core clinical conditions.
<u>Advice for Doctors who Supervise PAs and AAs</u>	Guidance from the GMC for doctors supervising PAs and AAs including information on delegation, teamworking and accountability.
<u>Core Capabilities Framework for Medical Associate Professions</u>	This framework identifies and describes the professional skills, knowledge and behaviours required for MAPs to deliver high-quality, compassionate care and support. This framework can help evidence capability and support structured development plans through 4 tiers of capability in 5 key areas: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • professional values, behaviours and practice • core clinical practice • leadership • education and life-long learning • quality improvement, research & scholarship
